Palestine Now In A State of Flux

Mrs. Rosita Forbes Believes That Muhammadans as a People Are Soon to be Regenerated.

London, Jan. 16.—Mrs. Rosita Forbes (Mrs. McGrath) is contemplating a tour in America in the spring. In those lectures she will tell not only of her explorations and adventures in the Near East, but of the political conditions there as she found and understands them.

"It is not out of mere adventure and curiosity that I have travelled so much in Muhammadan countries," Mrs. Forbes explained to a representative of The Christian Science Monitor, "but it is because I am a well-wisher of the Arab and a believer in the regeneration of his race. I have spent the past four years, often disguised as a man's woman, travelling and studying among the Muhammadans.

Palestine 92 Per Cent Arabian. "I believe, among other things, that Palestine should not be given to the Jews, not only because the population is 92 per cent Arabian, but because the Jews are not agriculturists and Palestine is a farming country. I believe that the Emir Feisal and his people are forming the nucleus about which the regeneration of the Muhammadans will eventually take place.

When word came last summer that the Allies had determined to support the Emir Feisal, Mrs. Forbes, who had just returned from her trip to Katana, once more put on her Arabian costume and went into Syria, where, during the month of August, she wandered about alone and collected political opinions. "The Muslims of the Near East are talking nothing but politics," said Mrs. Forbes. "The old isolation of their world has been destroyed by the war. The idea of being patient and passive and leaving all troubles to Kismet has vanished.

Response to New Doctrine. "The whole population has responded to the flood of Kemalist, Egyptian, Nationalist, and Bolshevik propaganda with which the country has been deluged. The Bolshevik is the most recent influence, as less than two years ago the word was unknown to Syria. Some wise and sane British propaganda is needed to counteract all this, for at present the attitude of Great Britain is a puzzle to the Arabs and other Muslims. They were anxious to obtain a settlement in Egypt before peace was made in Ireland, she went on, as they believed that while England had her hands occupied at home she would grant them better terms.

Royal Bank of Canada Closes Successful Year

Annual Meeting Featured by Addresses Dealing With Conditions and the Outlook in Canada—Sir Herbert S. Holt, President, Stated That the Bank's Organization and System of Supervision Were Unexcelled—Edson L. Pease, Vice-President, Points Out That Even After Exceptional Year, Bank's Strength Is Unimpaired—C. E. Neill, General Manager, Deals With Thoroughness of Bank's Audit.

The fifty-third annual meeting of the shareholders of the Royal Bank of Canada, which closed yesterday, was a successful year. As pointed out by Edson L. Pease, the Vice-President and General Manager, the bank's organization and system of supervision were unexcelled.

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Says England Handles Passengers Better

English Superintendent, However, Admits Freight Traffic is Handled Better in America.

London, Jan. 16.—Interchange of railway operating employees between England and the United States is suggested by F. V. Russell, operating superintendent of Great Eastern Railroad, of which Sir Henry Thornton, a Philadelphian and former American railroad man, is best of things contacted with back from a 25,000 mile trip of inspection through Canada and the United States.

"The United States has a tremendous number of things connected with its railways from which we could learn a great deal," Russell said.

Prohibition of Importation in Force Wednesday

The following memorandum has been sent out by the Department of Customs and Excise, Ottawa, Jan. 16, 1922: To the Collectors of Customs and Excise.
