King, Walker and McColl, Ministers, and Messrs. Urquhart, Taylor and McVicar,

The recommendation of the Buxton Mission Committee is as follows:
"The Committee recommend that the fund remain invested as it is at pre-

sent, Mr. King to receive the interest, as already approved, by the General Assembly, during his natural life, and at his death, the fund be disposed of, in any other way the Synod may direct."

The Clerk was instructed to hold the report and recommendation now presented to the Synod in retentis.

DISSENT AND COMPLAINT OF MR. D. GORDON AGAINST STRAT-FORD PRESBYTERY.

The Synod then proceeded to consider the dissent and complaint of Mr. D. Gordon against a decision of the Stratford Presbytery.

The papers in the case having been read, parties were called to the bar, Messrs. McPherson and Mitchell appeared on behalf of the Presbytery and Mr. Gordon for himself.

Questions having been put and answered, and the parties removed from the bar, the Synod proceeded to deliberate

Mr. Wilkins moved, seconded by Dr. Thomson, that the dissent and com-plaint be dismissed, and the ruling of the Presbytery of Stratford be sustained Pending the discussion of the motion, the Synod adjourned to meet again at

The Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

posed prior to adjournment, which was granted.

Mr. Wilkins then moved, seconded by Mr. McMechan, "Dismiss the dissent and complaint, and sustain the ruling of the Presbytery of Stratford, but inasmuch as it appears that the maintenance of a preaching station at Brooksdale, either alone or in connection with any other congregation than that of Har-
