THE LATE MR. L. T. MACPHERSON.

"In Mr. Macpherson has passed away one of our oldest citizens — one who has left behind him few who might strictly be regarded as his contemporaries. He was distinguished for unswerving rectitude, and for the most careful regard to all interests entrusted to him; and his unfailing courtesy, natural though it was to a Highland gentleman, recalled the older and in some things perhaps, the better days of Quebec. Mr. Macpherson, having long passed the ordinary span, carries with him to the grave that general respect which he had earned in a usefully, extended, and honorable life."

MISS MELINDA MCPHERSON.

"Our columns contain the obituary notice of one of the aged *Seigneuresses* of that picturesque Isle of the St. Lawrence, Crane Island. Her respected ancestor, Daniel McPherson, Esquire — "a true Scot" if ever there was one — had purchased this beautiful domain, (in 1803) from Captain Daniel Lienard de Beaujeu, a brother of the celebrated De Beaujeu, who won the battle of Monongahela in 1755. The seignory contains about 1000 souls. The spacious old manor stands out in relief on the shores of our noble river — a well-known landmark to sea-going vessels — and more than
