

Prohibited always, That all such Persons as since the Twenty fifth Day of March, One thousand six hundred eighty five, have Built, Cut out or Made (or at any time hereafter shall Build, Cut out or Make) any Houses, Stages, Cook-Rooms, Train-Fats, or other Conveniencies for Fishing there, that did not belong to Fishing Ships since the said year, One thousand six hundred eighty five, shall and may peaceably and quietly Enjoy the same to his or their own Use, without any Disturbance of or from any Person or Persons Whatsoever.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That all and every Person or Persons Whatsoever, that shall go over with their Servants to Newfoundland, to keep Boats on a Fishing Voyage, commonly called By-Boat-Keeper, shall not Pretend to or Meddle with any House, Stage, Cook-Room, Train-Fat, or other Conveniency, that did belong to Fishing Ships, since the year One thousand six hundred eighty five, or shall be Cut out or Made by Ships, from and after the said Twenty fifth day of March, One thousand seven hundred.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That every Master of a By-Boat, or By-Boats, shall Carry with him at least Two Fresh Men in six (viz.) one Man that hath made no more than one Voyage, and one Man who hath never been at Sea before; And that every
