Provided always, That all such Persons as since the Twenty sifth Day of March, One thousand six hundred eighty sive, have Built, Cut out or Pade (or at any time hereafter shall Build, Cut out or Pake) any Poules, Stages, Cook-Rooms, Train-Fats, or other Conveniencies for fishing there, that did not bestong to fishing Ships since the said year, One-thousand six hundred eighty sive, shall and may peaceably and quietly Injoy the same to his or their own Use, without any Disturbance of or from any Person or Persons Whatsoever.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid. That all and every Perfon or Persons whatsoever, that shall go over with their Servants to Newfoundland, to keep Boats on a fishing Aoyage, commonly called By-Boat-Keepers, shall not Pretend to or Meddle with any House, Stage, Cook-Room, Train-fat, or other Conveniency, that did belong to fishing Ships, since the year One thousand six hundred eighty sive, or shall be Cut out or Made by Ships, from and after the said Twenty sith day of March, One thousand seven hundred.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority atorelaid, That every Waster of a By-Boat, or By-Boats, shall Carry with him at least Two Fresh Wen in sir (viz.) one Wan that hath made no more than one Cloyage, and one Wan Who hath never been at Sea before; And that
