The U.S. Federal government has decided to fund a pilot program to treat and study childhood sexual abuse, which affects approximately one of every three children in this country


The \$150,000 (dollars) will be enough to treat 150 of the sexually-abused children in Washington, D.C., where the pilot program will begin. Dr. Frederick Green, associate director of the Children's Hospital National Medical Center estimated that the number of children grossly abused (Newscript)

sexually in the capital city each year is at least 350, and may approach 1,000.

Dr. Green said that sexual abuse of children occurs in families of every ethnic and economic background, is incestuous about half the time, and is

probably becoming more common. Because the sexual violation of children is viewed with such loathing by the public the extent of it is largely hidden, with two out of three cases unreported.
