Uplands, Ontario	November 8th 1944		Weather cloudy to overcast. Eight hours flying. Aircrew Leadership program put into operation for Course 122.	
	November 9th 1944		Overcast, rain showers, low clouds. Revival movie was shown in the Recreation Hall in the evening and many personnel of all ranks attended.	
	November 10th 1944		Intermittent rain. Very little flying. Commanding Officer's Parade held at 0730 hours this morning. The squadron composed of Training Wing personnel remained for inspection by the Commanding Officer.	
	November 11th 1944		Cloudy to overcast. A full day's flying. A two minute's silence was observed by all personnel on the Unit at 1100 hours, in honour of those who sacrificed their lives in the Last War and in this. It was announced today that Uplands oversubscribed its Seventh Victory Loan quota of \$100,000.00, an outstanding achievement in view of the present changes in personnel.	
	November 12th November 13th 1944		A full day's flying. Movie in the Recreation Hall in the evening. C.A.V.U. Nine hours solo flying. "Slipper Dance" in the Roundel Club in the evening for airmen and airwomen. Dress rehearsal for the Uplands Show. A message was received today from the Air Officer Commanding extending personal congratulations to the Commanding Officer and all personnel of the Unit on attaining our objective in the Seventh Victory Loan.	
	November 14th 1944		C.A.V.U. Section Commanders' meeting in Commanding Officer's office. Squadron Officer Henderson, Senior Personnel Counsellor from A.F.H.Q., visited the Unit. A meeting of all W.D.'s was called and Rehabilitation benefits and profits were discussed. The Station Show, "Ham 'n' Legs", was presented to a most enthusiastic audience. It was a fast moving, well directed revue and brought to light a great deal of local talent. The Army defeated Uplands, 42 to 30, in the League Basketball game.	
	November 15th 1944		Cloudy. Flying fit for 9½ hours solo. Music appreciation hour was enjoyed by many personnel in the W.D. Rec. Centre at 2000 hours.	
	November 16th 1944		Rain, snow, flying washed out for the day. Uplands W.D. Basketball team defeated Rockcliffe 34 to 14.	
	November 17th 1944		Partly cloudy. Flying washed in at 0800 hours and out at 1730 hours. Commanding Officer's parade held in the morning. Two Air Cadet Squadrons visited the station in the evening for purposes of taking Drill in the Drill Hall.	

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
