## The Rt. Honourable Arthur Meighen. -2 -

We have An Election, being the story of the last ten days of Parliament, which is, I think, very well prepared; it will be off the press by the middle of next week. Another pamphlet of four pages was placed with the printers to-day dealing specially with the Aziz case and comments thereon. In addition to these we have placed an order for 40,000 copies of "Hints to Scrutineers", which book had to be revised and corrected on account of a number of errors in the one issued last year, and changes made in the Election Act, especially as to alterations in the number of sections and pages as referred to in the Scrutineers' Book. I was in Toronto yesterday and had these corrections made and checked by Mr. Cylesdale, assisted by Mr. Cody of Mr. Ryckman's office. These books will be off the press next week and ready for distribution to all constituencies. Last year there were published 4,000 copies of the Speakers' Handbook, but during the last couple of weeks of the campaign, I find that renewal orders were received urging for thousands of copies, which it was impossible to fill owing to the short space of time remaining. This year we have ordered 10,000 copies of the handbook, and already I am inclined to think that the number will have to be increased, because of the special interest that seems to be taken in much of the material contained therein, relating to the Customs Investigation.

We are sending about thirty copies to each of the two hundred constituencies, that are wholly or largely English speaking, and an additional supply to each provincial headquarters. We are also sending two copies to every Conservative daily newspaper in the Dominion. Of the pamphlet, sample of which is enclosed, in connection with the smuggling and distribution of prison made garments in Canada detrimentally affecting Canadian industry and employment, we are publishing 100,000 copies, and probably will require more. In addition to a distribution through county campaign headquarters, and a supply to provincial central organizations, I am getting a list of Canadian clothing and am sending a number manufacturers from Mr. Sparks copies to each of these manufacturers, offering to supply them with as many as they find they can distribute to advantage throughout their plants and among their workmen, which we think will be very effective propaganda for that
