

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL:

The Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the recommendation of the Right Honourable Richard Bedford Bennett, the Prime Minister, and in the exercise of the authority conferred by the Employment and Social Insurance Act, Chapter 38 of the Statutes of Canada, 1935, is hereby pleased to appoint Colonel Gordon Sidney Harrington, LL.B., of the City of Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia, one of His Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, to be Chief Commissioner of the Employment and Social Insurance Commission, at a salary of \$10,000 per annum, and Tom Moore, Esquire, of the City of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario, President of the Trades and Labour Congress of Canada, and Nazaire Romeo Beaudet, Esquire, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, Civil Engineer and Insurance Manager, to be Members of the said Commission, at salaries of \$9,000 per annum; the said appointments to be effective for a period of ten years from the date hereof.
