Ottawa, 6th June, 1914.

Sir:-

with reference to your letter of the 30th ultimo, and your request for assistance to enable Thomas Kennedy to erect a house, I beg to say that in view of the feet that Kennedy is a hardworking Indian, the Department has decided to pay for lumber for him to the value of \$50.00. You should superintend the purchase and see that the lumber is used for the purpose for which it is bought. No further assistance will be given to Indians of your Agency toward erecting houses, and it should be definitely understood that in this case the aid is given owing to Kernedy's industrious habits as above referred to.
