- When you were driving the truck what clothes were you wearing? 0.
- Part of my uniform at all times. What I didn't have on me I A. carried in the truck.
- Did you carry any identification with you? 0.
- Yes, sir. I carried my "I" card at all times. A.
- Did you carry anything else? 0.
- My pass. A.
- Now, when you were working and building your house, how long Q. did you intend to stay working at that?
- Until I got my house finished. A.
- How long did you think that would take? 3.
- Until the first of November, 1944. A.
- What did you intend to do then? Q.
- I intended to go back to the army, sir.
- Now, will you tell the Court what happened on the 21st of September, 1944. Q.
- On the 21st of September I got up in the morning and a neighbour came over and wanted me to haul food for his cow. This cow was the one I got the milk for the family from so I thought I had better haul it in. Well, I was hauling food and while doing so I saw the Provost coming about a quarter of a mile away. I started to walk towards them and they stopped. I said, 'are you I told them. looking for me'. They said 'who are you'.
- How were you dressed at that time? Q.
- In my uniform, sir. A ..
- Did they ask any questions? 0.
- Yes, sir, they asked me if I had my "I" card. A.
- What did you tell them? 0.
- I said yes, sir. Aa
- Did you show it to them? Q.
- Yes, sir. A.
- Did they ask you anything else? Q.
- They asked me how long I had been gone. I said around about two months. They said they only got notice three days ago to pick me A.
- I have here a picture of a house. Do you recognize it? Q.
