

INTRODUCTION

**an, am
en, em** like nasalized [ɑ] as described above — Symbol [ã]: tant [tã], tante [tã:t], gant [gã], an [ã], viande [vjã:d], ehamph [jã], en [ã], enere [ã:kr], temps [tã], sembler [sãble].

EXCEPTIONS: en = [ẽ], see **ain**, etc., below, in some forms of **tenir**, **venir**, as a final sound, and in some other words: vient [vjẽ], tiendrai [tjẽdre], bien [bjẽ], examen [egzamẽ], chien [sjẽ], Benjamin [bẽzamẽ].

NOTE. — Observe **ennui** [ãnqi], **emmener** [ãmne], with doubled n, m, and **enivrer** [ãnivre].

**ain, aim
ein, eim
in, im
yn, ym** like nasalized [ɛ] as explained above — Symbol [ã]: pain [pã], faim [fã], plein [plã], peindre [pẽ:dr], Reims [rã:s], pin [pã], prince [prã:s], jardin [zardã], simple [sã:pl], impossible [ẽpõabl], syntaxe [sãtaks], symbole [sãbol].

NOTE. — Observe also the same sound in **tîmes** [tã:m], **vîmes** [vã:m].

on, om like nasalized [ɔ] as explained above — Symbol [õ]: bon [bõ], onele [ɔ:kl], mon [mõ], ont [õ], leçon [lõsõ], tomber [tõbe], ombre [õ:br], compter [kõte].

EXCEPTION: on in **monsieur** = [ø]: monsieur [mõsø].

**un, um
eun** like nasalized [œ] as explained above — Symbol [ã]: un [ã], chaeun [sakã], emprunter [ãprõte], parfum [parfã], à jeun [a zã].

oin for the sound of **oin**, see Semi-Vowels, below.

L. — Semi-Vowels

When **i**, **y**, **ou** do not of themselves form a syllable, but come before another vowel sound in the same syllable, they are pronounced with greater rapidity and tenseness of the vocal organs concerned, thus assuming a partially consonantal value, as described below, thus:

i, y like very brief and forcible **y** in 'yes' — Symbol [j]: viande [vjã:d], hier [je:r], fier [fje:r], bien [bjẽ], faſence [faʃã:s], yeux [jø], ayez [eje], payer [peje], Lyon [ljõ].

ou like very brief and tense **w** in 'we,' with close lip rounding and protrusion, as for whistling — Symbol [w]: oui [wi], jouer [zwe], louer [lwe], Louis [lwi].

NOTE. — When **u** of **gu**, **qu** (usually silent) is pronounced, as it sometimes is, it has the sound [w] before **a** in some words: lingual [lãgwal], équateur, [ekwatõ:r].

oi, of have the sound of [w]+[a] or [ã], the latter usually after **r**, and in a few other words: moi [mwa], voici [vwasi], boîte
