This coin seems to me rare as there are only two specimens known so far, one in the collection of Mr. R. W. McLachlan and the other in my own. As it will be noted by the illustration of the reverse, the latter is in poor state of preservation.

The similarity of the building shown on these two pieces, Nos. 360 and 361, to that appearing on the Blacks' tokens has induced me to class them among this series. And further, it has been claimed that the initials J. B. on the reverse of one of them stand for John Brown, the issuer of No. 359.
