During these sixty-three years, this school has held on its way with gradually increasing strength and has trained more than eight hundred ministers for the Canadian church. It has held fast to the Reformed type of doctrine and neither its professors nor its students have felt that they needed to apologize for so doing.

In the preaching of its graduates, divine sovereignty and human freedom, the impotency of fallen man and the all-sufficiency of divine grace, have been presented side by side, and God has owned and blessed the message.
