Wood, grain and produce are shipped. It contains Baptist and Methodist churches and a public school, and ships grain and produce. Stages daily to Port Burwell and Port Rowan. Population, 200. It contains Episcopal and Methodist churches and a public school, and ships live stock, grain, produce, lumber, timber and cordwood. Population, 100. Express, American. Mail daily. CLEVELANDS. A country post office on Lake Rosseau, in Medora township, Muskoka District, 26 miles north-west of Gravenhurst, the terminus of the M br N & N W Rys, its nearest railway point. Nearest bank at Orillia. Settled in 1868. It contains a summer hotel for tourists, and has an Episcopal church and public school, and ships lumber. Stage twice a week to Port Carling, 10 miles south, fare 25c. Population, 50. Mail semi-weekly. Charles J Minett, postmaster.
