

11. *Cider Cake.*

Take two pounds of flour, one pound of sugar, half a pound of butter, one pint of cider, cloves and cinnamon, with or without fruit, two tea-spoonsful of saleratus; put the saleratus in the cider, and mix it while foaming.

N. B.—As a general rule, every thing mixed with saleratus should be put in the oven immediately.

12. *Albany Cake.*

Take one pound and a half of flour, one of sugar, half a pound of butter, a table-spoonful of lard, two table-spoonsful of rose water, a little cinnamon, one egg, a tea-spoonful of saleratus; put in a tea cup of cream. Cut them out, and bake them on tin.

13. *Election Cake.*

Take five pounds of flour, two of sugar, three quarters of a pound of butter, five eggs, five large spoonsful of yeast, one pint of milk, and spice as you please.

14. *Black Cake.*

Take one pound of sugar, the same of flour and butter, with ten eggs; beat them well, and add them to the rest; then put two wine-glasses of brandy; nutmeg, mace, and cloves, equal quantities; two pounds of raisins, and the same quantity of currants. Some hours will be required to
