

At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Fifth day of February 1818, in the Fifty-Eighth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great-Britain and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c. &c. &c. being the Eighth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.\*

### CAP. I.

An ACT to continue and amend the several Acts of the General Assembly, for the further increase of the Revenue, by raising a duty of Excise on all Goods, Wares and Merchandise, imported into this Province.

**B**E it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That the Act, made in the thirty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the further increase of the Revenue, by raising a Duty of Excise on all Goods, Wares and Merchandise, imported into this Province. Also, the Act, made in the forty-eighth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, for repealing so much of the aforesaid Act as exempts from such Duty certain articles therein enumerated, and for declaring what Goods, Wares and Merchandise, shall hereafter be exempt from such Duty of Excise. And also, the Act, made in the fifty-fourth year of his present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act to continue the several Acts of the General Assembly for the further increase of the Revenue, by raising a Duty of Excise on all Goods, Wares and Merchandise, imported into this Province; and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, be continued, and the same are hereby continued, until the eighteenth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and no longer.

And whereas, the several Acts of Impost and Excise, the penalties, forfeitures, provisions, conditions and regulations, of which, are extended to the foregoing Acts, have been repealed, and are expired, and
