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REPORT ON PAUPER PETITIONS.

THE attention of the House of Assembly having been particularly called by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to the present objectionable mode of affording relief to Paupers and Lunatic, your Committee beg to remark, that they cannot recommend any alteration to be adopted at present, as they are of opinion that any change in the system might be liable to equal, or perhaps greater, disadvantages than the present mode; and further, as the building now in course of erection for a Lunatic Asylum, and other charitable purposes, will probably be completed in the course of this year, when your Committee trust the House of Assembly will be in a great measure relieved from the unpleasant duty they now have to perform in this service.

Your Committee having maturely considered the subject to them referred, are of opinion that Petitioners and others, for whom aid is solicited, be relieved according to the amounts respectively attached to their names in the following scale:—
