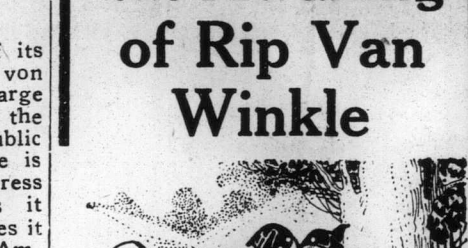
Von Popen's Phrase of "Idiotic" Gets Commented by Press
