



**BRITISH DESTROY U-BOAT**

THE NEW YORK MIN  
No Casualties  
Vessel

New York, April 10.—New York Times this morning publishes following:  
The British have been destroying U-boats at the average rate of one a day since February 1, and lately at an even higher rate, according to information brought to Washington by the German declaration of unrestricted submarine warfare. British ships sank twenty-two submarines. Since then the average number destroyed has risen to three a day. British naval officers assert that the methods in fighting the submarines are being improved constantly. A small motor boat, known as a "submarine chaser" following in the wake of destroyers dragging cables or chains between them has most of the U-boats with a new explosive bomb effective within a circumference of 200 yards. Airships are used also, while the practice of equipping merchant ships with forward, as well as aft, has caused the destruction of several U-boats. British officers say the German profess to be turning out a submarine a day, but they do not see how submarines, manned by competent crews can be sent to sea at this rate.

Liverpool, April 10.—The American liner New York struck a mine 7.40 p.m. last night, five miles off Liverpool. No casualties were reported. The vessel later proceeded to Liverpool.

Consul Washington at Liverpool reporting the incident to the State Department today said:  
No Casualties.  
"The American liner New York struck a mine 7.40 p.m. last night five miles off Liverpool. Bar. company reports passengers landed at Liverpool except four who, still on the ship. No casualties. Vessel proceeded under own steam." is now (one o'clock this morning) entering her dock.

New York, April 10.—The American Line Steamship New York, this port on March 29 with 58 passengers, cargo and mail. She carried a naval crew of gunners and armed. The ship's crew consisted 314 men and was commanded Captain W. J. Roberts.
