#### THE CZAR'S REPLY.

Will Say Parliament Is Trying to In-fringe Royal Prerogative.

St. Petersburg, May 19.—The issue of the first encounter between the monarch and the representatives of the people hangs for the minute in the balance. Though the representative chamber of Parliament and the Council of the Empire adopted addresses in reply to the speech from the throne, no answer has been given to either address, and none is expected before Monday.

The imperial reply, which will be delivered through the medium of a speech by Premier Goremykin, probably at the first session of the House after President Mouromtseff has been received at Peterhoff, will be temperate and deliberate, seeking to avoid occasion of rupture, but on the other hand not concealing the Emperor's view that Parliament in many respects has attempted to infringe the imperial prerogative. On these points the response will be a calm refusal.



London, May 19.—The House of Lords Thursday, by 96 to 24 votes, rejected the second reading of the bill introduced into the House of Commons by James Keir Hardie, the labor leader, the object of which is to prohibit the entrance into Great Britain of aliens to take the place of British workmen during trade disputes. The measure had previously passed all stages in the House of Commons without discussion.
