### THE SESSION.

The session just closed at Ottawa has been a short one, but the quantity of work done has been over and above the average. In the last session of the session, introduced and about 130 passed into law, while in 1886 the number of bills passed was 119 with 101 in 1885. The work done has been important in its relations to the business interests of the country. A large amount of railway legislation has been got through, no fewer than forty bills of this character having been passed. The increase of the iron duties has been an important feature of the legislation of the session, and though the application of the National policy to this industry created much opposition at home and abroad, this opposition seems to have been the temporary business irritation that naturally follows any disturbance of tariff rates, and which is now gradually clearing away. It is believed that the action of the government was the only one consistent with commercial wisdom for the establishment of a substantial basis for the development of the iron industry of the Dominion. There has not been much party blood spilt during the session, the opposition, aware of their weakness, avoiding an engagement with their opponents as much as possible. The session has also supplied very little campaign material that could be used in the coming year's grist during election time. The only thing perhaps that affords them an opportunity for working popular prejudices is the Queen's coronation. This has sufficient room exterior to be a powerful political agent on minds inclined to be influenced by surface appearances. These rugged outlines will lose none of their harshness in the deft hands of graphic artists when being presented to popular assemblies. There is an appearance of political opposition about this matter, which, though it is not in its shape at the first attempt at analysis, may produce much mischief when worked for political effect. The facts in the case, it will be remembered are these: Mr. King, the Liberal candidate, retained at the election in February last a majority of sixty-one of the votes cast, but the returning officer, Mr. Dunn, declared the minority candidate, Mr. Baird, elected, because of an informality in the manner of Mr. King's nomination. The opposition in Parliament moved to have the return amended by inserting Mr. King's name in place of that of Mr. Baird; the Minister of Justice moved to refer the case to the committee on Privileges and Elections, which course was pursued. The committee reported against any interference on the part of the house, and this report was adopted, the effect being to give the seat to Mr. Baird, leaving Mr. King to seek redress before the courts.

There is of course a natural sympathy with the candidate who had a majority of votes, but it must be remembered that since the trial of controversial election cases has been relegated to the courts, both in Canada and the United Kingdom, there has been no case of parliamentary interference, and it would be a serious mistake to interpose a precedent for again throwing such cases into a partisan house for a settlement which justly belongs to the courts. Mr. King had the courts for him, and the response to his cry for not appealing to them to right any injury from which he may be suffering must rest with him.

The retirement of Mr. Blake from the leadership of the Liberal party, and perhaps from the field of politics, has been as it is thought probable he will never enter the House again, is another prominent event of the session. His retirement is a great loss to the country, which will lose his great legal ability and splendid qualities of mind from a position where those attainments are necessary for sound political growth.

A vote on prohibition near the end of the session showed that there was a majority of forty against it, but that the vote in its favor was the largest that has ever been recorded in the House.

The explanations of the Premier of the condition of the fisheries negotiations gave general satisfaction to the House, and created the conviction that the protection of this great industry was in good hands.

hands and that the fishermen of Canada had good reasons to expect a beneficial settlement of the question.

The government showed itself to be strong for all legislative purposes and possessed of an enthusiastic following that it would seem almost impossible to weaken or diminish.
