much more a cure than that of the invading force, which with every day's march will be moving further away from its base of supplies, and entering a broken country full of ambushes.

ROYAL THE PRISONER. WINNIPEG, March 30.—Royal, who succeeded Riel as the member for Provencher, left for Ottawa today to offer the government his services as intermediary. He says the department of the interior at Ottawa is to blame for the trouble, and that it was warned the half breeds would rise unless their demands received recognition from the government.

WHO IS RESPONSIBLE? When Mr. Blake stated that he would hold the members of the Government personally and politically responsible for any negligence that might occur in connection with the raising and equipment of the forces to be sent to the Northwest he was warmly applauded by the whole House, and even Mr. Caron assented. But at the sight of his own followers applauding Mr. Blake, Sir John Macdonald seemed to lose his head, and asserted that the declaration which his followers had applauded was "an impudent threat." The House was then derestricted at such a petty exhibition of ill temper, and when Mr. Blake repeated his statement he was cheered again.

There is tremendous excitement in Calgary and Regina over the reported uprising of the Blackfeet. But no surprise is expressed, as the Indians during the winter have experienced unparalleled privations. Deaths from starvation have been by no means uncommon, and men, women and children show the emaciated appearance the terrible trial they have endured is being sent to them, and hopes are yet entertained that the number induced to join the half breeds will be comparatively small. Many have already offered their services to the government, so that at the worst there will probably be as many on one side as the other.

WINNIPEG, April 1st. News from east of trouble is very alarming since this morning around Hatfield, where Indian bands under Poundmaker, Little Two and Strike Him-on-the-Back, infest the town, and surround residents and settlers now closely besieged in barracks awaiting reinforcements.

The movements of Riel with upwards of two thousand rebels and Indians are mysterious since the fall of Fort Carlton, and it is now believed he will turn up at Battleford, which is only seventy miles west.

The Stoners and Cross from Eagle Hills South-east of Battleford, and the bands who killed the two Farm Instructors James Hayna and Geo. E. Applegarth and two others, supposed to be settlers. They drove cattle and horses of settlers before them as they advanced to join other Indians.

Some settlers coming in were robbed of their horses, wagons and load, and set on foot. Other settlers are coming in from distant settlements, and are collected in the barracks awaiting events. Private despatches received this morning confirm reports of murder and pillage at Battleford by Cree Indians.

It is stated here that if Crees are on the warpath, the Blackfeet will be only too glad to assist the Government to average an old grudge against their own enemies.

The detachment of Mounted Police left by Colonel Irvine at Battleford have telegraphed for permission to destroy stores there, as an attack by rebels is apprehended.

MACDONALD AND RIEL. Sir John's correspondence in reference to Riel was in 1871, and the Ontario proclamation offering a reward for his apprehension and conviction was not issued until 1872. How could Sir John then say that Mr. Blake's offer of a reward had driven Riel across the border.

Sir John knew at the negotiations he had carried on months before with Archbishop Tache. He knew that he had paid the money out of the public treasury to support Riel while he was out of the country. He knew that he had given the Archbishop the assurance that if this were done no harm should come to Riel, but that after the elections were over the Government would protect him against the consequences of his crime.

And yet in the face of these recorded facts Sir John Macdonald declared in the House on Thursday that he would have been tried and convicted, and that nothing would have prevented the law from taking its course.—[London Advertiser.]

THE FENIANS. OTTAWA, March 31, 1885. There is considerable talk throughout the city and within the house of a Fenian raid being intended. It is rumored that the 43rd Battalion, Ottawa, is ordered to report immediately at Prescott.

The war fever runs high here and hundreds are pressing their services for the front and the disappointed ones are pleased with the prospects of the Fenians coming to the front, as offering them a chance of service, believing the Fenians to be in communication with the Northwest rebels. The government was said to be in receipt of numerous communications from detectives over the line today.

While the insurgents are supplied with all the latest and most modern arms the volunteers are badly equipped in this respect, the Enfields being long out of date. Still there is the bravest spirit abroad, fanned, of course, by an intense feeling of indignation.

THE RIEL CASE.

Hon. Edward Blake on the Situation.

Sir John A. Macdonald's Double-dealing known to.

The following details took place on Friday last: Mr. Blake was received with great applause. He said he rose to call attention to a subject with reference to which he thought the Government had not treated the House with proper respect. This was the question of the Northwest disturbances. The House and the country had been kept by the Government in the dark as far as it could be done, and when called upon the Premier had not given the information which he should.

The papers say that Gen. Middleton is on the way to the North west to take charge. A special dispatch from Winnipeg was read to show that the situation was serious, and was stated that the half breeds had good grounds for complaining. The Montreal Gazette and the Ottawa Citizen had each published the statement that at grievances had existed in regard to the land claims for years among parties who had been unable to procure their patents. Speculators and others who have given fees to persons having influence in Ottawa obtained deeds, and in many instances had taken land over the heads of the first settlers, who had in some cases been for fifteen or eighteen years, and that this was the real cause for the trouble. The outbreak was a very serious occurrence, and Parliament should at once have been furnished with the fullest information. This was the law in England, where, whenever it was at any time necessary to call out militia, it was compulsory that Parliament should be called together within ten days.
