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The meeting of the senate of the University of Alberta, to have been held Tuesday, was postponed owing to the absence of Dr. Tory, who was called to Westmont, Montreal, by the illness of his brother. He expects to return next week and the meeting will likely be held then.

Very rapid progress is being made by Lakelock Matheson on the grade from the present street car terminus to the packing plant. All the material for the line is now ready and an exceptionally fast piece of extension work over this line is promised.

About 135 men are engaged at present in putting in services for water and sewer connection in different parts of the city. The concrete sewer pipe, laid over from last year, is being used pending the settling of the dispute as to the quality of pipe now being supplied by the Standard Heating and Plumbing Company.

FORMER ENGINEER HERE. The first city engineer of Edmonton is paying a visit to the city at present in the person of John Armstrong, now of Winnipeg. Mr. Armstrong, who is stopping at the Alberta on a few days' holiday, was city engineer in 1925, but resigned to accept a position with the G.T.P. He is now chief engineer for the Hudson's Bay Railway, with his headquarters at Winnipeg. Mr. Armstrong expects to leave on return to the east in the course of a day or two.

LOCAL MAN WALKING TO COAST. C. Buckley Faulkner, of Edmonton, passed through Calgary Tuesday on route to the coast. Mr. Faulkner, who is a well-known local sportsman, is on his way to the coast to walk the whole distance from Edmonton to the coast. He will probably walk the remainder of the way to the coast. His original intention was to walk the whole distance from Edmonton to the coast but the bad weather during the latter part of last week caused him to change his mind and travel by rail to Calgary and on to Logan.

SIGNING DEBENTURES. The last batch of debentures for municipal expenditures of the present year have come to hand, and Mayor Lee will be kept busy for the next two or three days signing them up for delivery about the middle of June. There are 1,876 debentures in all, representing £100 each, or a total of about \$900,000 that will be forthcoming from the purchasers, Coates, Son & Co. of London, England, in the next few weeks. This is the issue of 4 1/2 per cent debentures sold by the city several months ago at the exceptionally good price of 101.63.
