"Then y o u don't trust me." "My dear, you know perfectly that I'd trust y o u anywhere and that I feel you are safe with Carl as y o u would be with your own brother."

"Because it won't look well, Dorothy, and we live in a world of other people."

"Looks, looks, looks—Oh, I am so sick of hearing about 'looks.' What difference do appearances make if I do what's right?"

"As I listened to that conversation the other day between one of my friends and her eighteen-year-old daughter, I wondered if there were a mother in this land of convention hating young folks who had not had a somewhat similar conversation with her particular Dorothy."

Again and again, both in my own and other people's homes and in my letters, I've met the substance of that impatient question of Dorothy's—

"What difference do appearances make if I do what's right?"

Just the difference between a clean, good road and a rough, uneven road strewn with obstacles, just the difference between a fair wind and a continually opposing one, on the highway to success and achievement.

Sometimes the rebels against convention say, "But if it is a question between conscience and convention."

between doing right and appearing to do right, isn't it much better to be true to yourself?"

HOUSEHOLD NOTES.

If an article is blued too deeply soak it for awhile in a pan of boiling water in which is dissolved sufficient cream of tartar, to make it sour to the taste. Soak for 10 to 15 minutes and then hang up to bleach.

For a piquant sauce for meat or fish have a brown sauce ready for the foundation, and season it with a tablespoonful of vinegar, according to the amount; add a chopped shallot and a tablespoonful each of capers and pickles mixed fine.

In polishing silver that has been laid away and badly tarnished it is a good plan to dip a portion of a soft oil-cloth in sweet oil or soft lard, then in whiting. Rub the article well until the black has disappeared, then finish with whiting.

If there is cold boiled ham to be used up, mince it fine in the food chopper and mix it with mashed potatoes, a little bread crumbs and an egg or two, according to quantity. Season with butter, salt and pepper, form into croquette shapes and fry in deep hot lard.

Pineapples, delicious at all seasons, solve the problem of many a dessert; sliced and served plain, or with oranges and cocoanuts, they are tasty. They may be used as a flavoring for a moussé or ice cream or cut into jelly.

To grill a piece of lamb, score the

top, brush it over with the beaten yolk of an egg, dredge it with salt and pepper, cover with a layer of bread crumbs and bake, basting with butter every 15 minutes. When it is done garnish with current jelly and serve with caper sauce.

In candying fruit it is well to remember that if the fruit is kept in air tight tin boxes it will keep much longer and better than in any other way. In glass jars, unless they are wrapped in paper the fruit is exposed to the light, and this has a deleterious effect.

Smoking and Drinking.

More Beer and less Whiskey Consumed in Canada.

Ottawa, July 10.—During the fiscal year which closed with March 31 the people of Canada consumed spirits to the amount of .815 gallon, as compared with .806 in the previous year, a slight increase. The consumption of beer per head was 5.276 gallons, wine .97 gallons, and of tobacco 2.940 pounds. In the previous year the consumption per head of beer was 5.248 gallons, of wine .85 gallons, and of tobacco, 2.910 pounds. As compared with thirty years ago, when two gallons of liquor were consumed for every head of population, the consumption of spirits is small. On the other hand, there has been a steady increase in the consumption of beer, and a steady but not abnormal increase in the use of tobacco.

Portugal Against Rome

Archbishop's Decree Suppressing a Newspaper is Nullified by State.

Lisbon, July 15.—A royal decree has been issued nullifying the action of Archbishop Braga, who, on orders from Cardinal Merry del Val, the Papal Secretary of State, suppressed "The Franciscan Review," which, he maintained, although Christian and Catholic, was not necessary to the support of the National Catholic party.

The decree says that the Archbishop had no right to execute religious instructions without the previous consent of the government, and warns him that a repetition of this action will be likely to arouse a conflict, which cannot be tolerated.

Famous Beauty.

Perfect Model of Womanhood Dies Almost penniless.

Miss Louise Montague, advertised throughout the world thirty years ago as the most beautiful woman in America, and winner of a £2,000 prize beauty contest, has died in a small apartment house in New York, lone and almost penniless.

She was discovered by Adam Fore-augh, Barnum's greatest circus rider. He started a £2,000 beauty contest, and after awarding the prize to Miss Montague, made her the principal feature of his show. She reigned on a golden chariot in the street processions, and exhibited herself in the circus. All Americans went mad over her, as the most perfect model of womanhood the United States has produced.

Later Miss Montague went on the stage, utilizing her excellent soprano voice and her dramatic ability in musical comedy. She was the rage for a number of years, and then drifted back into private life, to die forgotten.

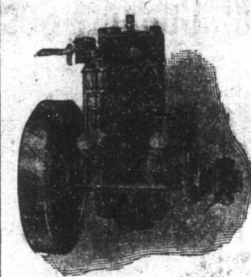
