BE CAREFUL FOR YOUR EYES.

The Navy and the Trawler.

(From the New York Times.)

Senator McCumber, of North Dakota, fails to understand why the navy, "with all its might, has been unable to seek out this little trawler," meaning the Triumph, which recently was seized and turned into an armed raider by the commander of a U-boat on the Atlantic Coast. "It cannot go under the water and hide," says the Senator of the raiding trawler, as if that settled the question. Has he heard of the exploits of the converted merchantmen Mowe, which several times ran the gauntlet of the strong and vigilant British patrol in the North Sea and Channel and in two cruises sank 57,000 and 112,000 tons of shipping respectively? Did the Senator make a note of the annoying activity of the German raiders, Wolf and Wolf's Cub, which played havoc with Government as well as with merchant ships in the Gulf of Aden, the Mediterranean, the Atlantic, and other waters, finally reaching the North Sea, and in the case of the Wolf, Kiel, without being intercepted? One of the Wolf's victims was the British minelaying steamer Turritella of 5,538 tons. The Seadler, formerly the American ship Pass of Baltimore, led a merry life for seven months as a German raider, until she was stranded on one of the Society Islands; but as she confined her depredations to the Pacific, she is not so good an example. None of these adventures could "go under the water and hide," but can a North Dakota Senator be expected to understand that compared with the dimensions of a trawler the Atlantic Ocean is quite spacious? There must be a long list of German raiders that have played hide and seek successfully with the British, French, and Italian navies. "Why cannot the navy?" demands Mr. McCumber, "use some of its fleet to capture this little trawler?" Give the Navy time, Senator, the little trawler has not been out very long under the enemy's flag. Moreover, our navy, what with conveying transports, helping the British and French to hunt submarines on the other side of the Atlantic, and co-operating with the British battle fleet in readiness for a sea fight with the German Navy, has other business to do of greater importance than ending the career of a small lone raider prowling about the Western Atlantic. Some of our keen naval officers are on the job now, and if Mr. McCumber will resign himself to waiting he may hear some morning that the little trawler has been sunk or captured—perhaps, through a ruse, which would seem to be in order.

Man who Sank Lusitania

REPORTED CAPTURED BY FRENCH PATROL BOAT.

Paris, Aug. 27.—Lieut. Schwieger, the man who sank the Lusitania, has been captured by a French patrol boat in the Mediterranean, according to Le Journal. A large submarine of which he was second in command had just torpedoed a British steamer between Malta and Sicily. The German was waiting to see the vessel sink when the French patrol boats emerged from the fog and sank the U-boat. Of the crew of 75 only one officer and four men were rescued by the patrol boats. While being taken to Toulon, the officer appeared ill at ease. When he thought no one was looking he tried to throw some papers overboard, but a sailor seized him. He refused to answer questions, but an examination of his papers explained his uneasiness. Le Journal says if the man who committed "the most vile, the most barbarous and the most cowardly act in the annals of the war," is merely to be sent to a prison camp.
