IMPEACHMENT OF JUDGES.

A few days ago a petition from lawyers, and other citizens of Aylmer, County of Ottawa, was presented to the House of Commons against Justice Lafontaine, charging him with forgery, incapacity, falsification of the Court records, and defalcation of Government money while he was Crown Lands Agent. It is understood that his Lordship will be impeached before the House. Another Lower Canadian judge, Justice Drummond is likely to be proceeded against in like manner.
