Washington, D.C., April 17.—Dreadnoughts have won the greatest victory of the European War without firing a shot. Assistant - Secretary the operation performed." Why is this? Thirsty Chicks.

Abnormal thirst in incubator chicks is generally caused from keeping them too long in a poorly ventilated and too warm incubator. This seldom happens in winter, but occasionally in hot weather. To guard against this, keep them from panting by lowering the temperature somewhat, and increasing the ventilation.
