

FIND AUTOMOBILE HIDDEN IN SHACK

Toronto Detective Believes
Car Used in Woodstock
Liquor Theft.

[Special to London Advertiser.]
WOODSTOCK, Jan. 24.—A large six-cylinder Paige automobile has been found, carefully concealed, in an old shack on the 12th line of East Zorra, about half a mile south of Tavistock, by Detective Hodgins of Toronto, who had been directed to the spot by a young man arrested in the Queen City a few days ago. The detective states that the car was stolen last October. It seems that the car is closely connected with the theft of liquor which took place here last October, when a local resident's cellar was broken into and a large quantity of goods taken.

When the car was found Saturday the batteries, key and license plates were missing.
The plates were found some time ago concealed in a bag of chop sold in Tavistock by a young man who was connected with the liquor robbery.
Detective Hodgins is said to be in possession of information which may lead to interesting developments.
At the time the car was stolen it was said to have been taken by persons connected with the liquor traffic.

Fire 300 Constables To Reorganize Police in Essex County.

WINDSOR, Jan. 23.—Announcing a plan to reorganize county police system, Crown Attorney Urquhart this afternoon sent registered letters to all county constables, numbering 300, that they will be removed from office next Monday by Judge Coughlin at Sandwich.
The crown informed the constables that they must appear before the court if they wish to be reinstated. It is also planned to ask each municipality to appoint one or more paid officers to replace the present county officers.
"There has been little co-operation among county officers," the crown attorney explained to The Advertiser.

EAST ELGIN LIBERAL CONVENTION PLANNED

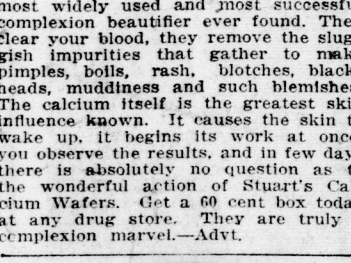

LOEW'S THEATRE PASSES DIVIDENDS

TORONTO, Jan. 23.—For the current quarter the dividends on the preferred stock of Loew's London Theatre, Limited, and Loew's Hamilton Theatre, Limited, have been passed.
"We are acting on the same lines as if it were our private business until we see how earnings develop in the next quarter," said a director today.
It was learned that the liabilities of the London theatre have been greatly reduced, and it is expected that they will soon be paid off. The London theatre is making fair earnings.
At Hamilton the effect of the industrial depression is more apparent, and it is probable that any great increase in attendance cannot be expected there until business improves. At the same time, it is said that the directors of the theatres are hopeful that the suspension of the dividend will be of a temporary character.

WOMAN DEFYING COURT ARRESTED

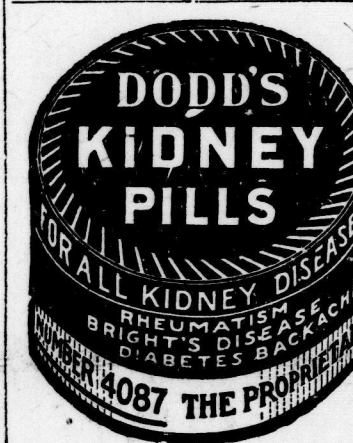

VETERAN INSTRUCTOR AT U. OF T. SUCCUMBS

TORONTO, Jan. 23.—"Prof." Alfred "Casey" Williams, for 20 years physical instructor of the University of Toronto, died this afternoon at the General Hospital, following a two-year illness of bronchitis, which finally developed into double pneumonia.
"Prof." Williams was born in England, and came to Toronto some 30 years ago. He entered the physical instruction staff of the university and his name became known throughout Canada, the United States, and, in fact, wherever athletes competed. Two years ago he was taken ill, and since then had been on the retired list of the university.
A son, Harold, was killed in France, while serving with the C. M. R., while Mrs. Williams died shortly after news of the son's death reached Toronto.

ADJOURN CHARGES OF PERJURY AT BRANTFORD

BRANTFORD, Jan. 23.—Charges of perjury against two provincial "spotters," Alexander Shepek and Edward Chippin, were adjourned until Friday. No evidence was taken today when the cases were called.
M. M. MacBride, M.L.A., is the complainant against both officers, who testified at the hearing of a charge of selling liquor, upon which Louis Stander was fined \$1,500 by Magistrate Massie in December. He has appealed against the conviction.



WILL CONSIDER RAIL SITUATION

MONTREAL, Jan. 23.—The general grievance committee of the Grand Trunk Railway employees who are represented in the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway Employees, will meet in Toronto on Monday, Jan. 30, to consider the present railway situation.
The Canadian Brotherhood represents some 20,000 men employed on Canadian lines. Officials of the Grand Trunk stated today that no notices for discussion of wage agreements have been issued by the company.
The company considers as binding the previous tentative agreement which was entered into by the employees and afterwards repudiated, it was said. No question of further negotiations with a view to entering into a permanent agreement has yet arisen.
