The defendant has started a business in Melinda-street under the same name and her travelers are receiving and filling orders intended for the plaintiff.

Mr. John Macgregor, acting on behalf of tlients, issued two writs against Sheriff Widdifield and Robert Rumble, a Vaughan constable. In one action Alfred Gordon sues the defendants for \$5000 damages for false arrest, imprisonment and malicious prosecution. In the other J. A. Beatty sues for \$3000 damages on the same grounds. Gordon and Beatty were accused of obstructing a bailiff in the discharge of his duty, and at the assiess now going on in Toronto both men were acquitted without being called on for their defence. A writ was also issued by John Gordon against Duncan McMillan of Maple claiming \$2000 for slander. In the case of the Canadian Lumber Cutting Machine Company (Limited) v. Executors of Robert Hay the defendants asked Chief Justice Armour yesterday in single court to order the plaintiffs to pay into court all moneys received from sales as a condition of continuing the injunction restraining them from interfering with the company's business until the trial of the action of the plaintiff company claiming damages against the Hay estate. The Chief Justice suggested that the case should be tried next week at Cobourg, the defendants having asked that the case should be tried next week. The injunction was then continued as originally granted by Chief Justice Galt without imposing any terms on the plaintiffs, who sow can conduct their business as to then seems proper.
