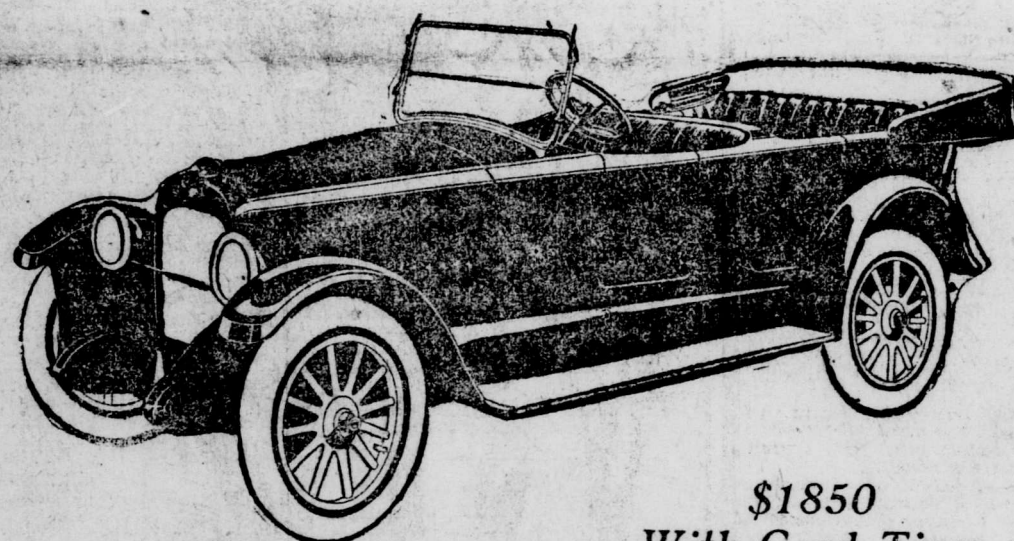

McGill Wins In Intercollegiate

Tops Varsity by 62 to 55 by
Landing All the Sprints

TORONTO, Oct. 29.—The athletic meeting of the Canadian Intercollegiate Athletic Association was held at Varsity Stadium this afternoon, and resulted in a victory for McGill, who won eight events to Varsity's four, and scored 62 points to 55 for Varsity. Royal Military College won the mile run and Manitoba University the discus throwing. As the latter had not been admitted a member of the association, but was competing as an invited guest, the points contest was between McGill and University of Toronto. Farquhar, of McGill, upset the dope by defeating Carruthers in the 120-yard hurdle at the same time setting a new figure of 16.25 as compared with the former intercollegiate record of 17 seconds. Leigh, of Toronto, chopped 3 1/2 seconds off a record when he ran three miles in 16 minutes, 15 1/2 seconds.

McGill won all the sprints, both jumps, the hurdles, the hammer throw and the pole vault. Varsity won the half-mile, the three mile, relay run and shotput.

The weather was most inclement which added to the merit of most of the performances.
