A BILL

To incorporate the Howard Division, No. 1, of the County of St. Andrews, in the Province of New Brunswick.

Section I.—Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, in an Act to incorporate the Howard Division, No. 1, of the County of St. Andrews, in the Province of New Brunswick, that the said Division, No. 1, be and the same be incorporated in and be a Corporation, to be known by the name of the "Howard Division, No. 1, of the County of St. Andrews, in the Province of New Brunswick," and by that name shall have all the general powers, authorities and privileges made incident to a Corporation by act of Assembly in this Province for the aforesaid purpose, and those only. Provided, always, that the real estate which the said Corporation may hold at any time shall not exceed six hundred pounds.

Section II.—And be it enacted, that no member of the said Division or association, shall have any power to assign, transfer, or set over unto any person or persons, whatsoever, any interest which he may have in, or claim to the funds or property of the said Division or association; but the same shall at all times after the passing of this Act, be subject to, and under the control of the said Division or association.

Section III.—And be it enacted, that no funds or property of any kind whatsoever belonging to the said Division or association, shall be subject to the payment of the debts of any of its members; upon shall the same be liable to be attached, or taken in execution, by any judgment, creditor, or creditors, against any of the members of the said Division or association.

Section IV.—And be it enacted, that the property and funds of the said Division or association, shall alone be responsible for the debts and engagements of the same.
