"And all the women whose heart stirred them up in wisdom, spun *goats' hair*." (*Exodus 35.25.*)

Every one whom God called to help in the making of His Tabernacle, had his or her own proper work to do; and we may be sure these 'wise-hearted women' whose work it was to spin *goats' hair*, were quite content to help in this way, even though their work was not so interesting as that of the others, or made so much show when it was done. So it ought to be with us now. We ought to do whatever work the Lord appoints for us, and not care so much what the work itself is, or whether we get credit for it.
