

No it is not angry, it is hungry. Yes, yes it is hungry. I remember, but when one is hungry it does not take much to make one angry. You're right, my boy, a hungry man is very often an angry man.

There's a word which expresses the state of a person whose stomach calls, not for food but for drink; what is the word. I don't know what it is, —perhaps it is *dry*.

Dry is not a bad word,—a man who wants to drink, may say: "I am very dry; but there's a better word, what is it? I don't know what it is.

Well it is *thirsty*.

Now, why are the boy and the horse drinking? They are drinking because they are *dry*.

Give the answer using the word which I have just told you. I can't, I have forgotten it.

Already? Already, yes, I have a very good memory for forgetting.

Yes, I suppose so, I think it would be better to say that you have a bad memory for remembering.

The word I told you is *thirsty*, try to remember it? All right, I'll try.

Why are the boy and the horse drinking. They are drinking because they are *thirsty*.

What is the word *hungry*? is it a verb or a preposition? It is neither a verb nor a preposition, it is an adjective.

Give the noun from which it is formed? It is formed from the noun *hunger*.

What is the word *thirsty*? It is an adjective.

What makes people *thirsty*? Heat and work make people *thirsty*.

How do heat and work make people *thirsty*? I know that they make people *thirsty* but I have no notion of how they do it.

Would you like to know how they make people *thirsty*? Yes, I would very much like to know it.

In the first place boys and horses *sweat* or *perspire*. Do you understand these words *sweat* and *perspire*? No I don't understand them at all.

If a boy or a horse runs a long race he or it will be covered with small drops of water, the drops of water will fall from the boy's forehead. Again if the day is very hot the boy and the horse will be covered with small drops of water. The drops of water on the boy's forehead, on the horse's flanks and neck are *sweat* or *perspiration*. We say that the boy and horse are *sweating* or *perspiring*. Now do you understand the words *sweat* and *perspiration*? Yes, sir, I understand the words *sweat* and *perspiration* perfectly.

What is *sweat* or *perspiration*? *Sweat* or *perspiration* is the water that comes on the body of a boy and a horse when the weather is hot or when they work hard.
