Your committee would further suggest that wherever it may be practicable, for Divisions to advance the cause of Temperance by means of total abstinence societies, although not in a position to form Divisions of the Order, such efforts it is to be hoped, would be followed with the very best results, and be a most successful means in paving the way for the formation of new Divisions.
