The returns to the Ont dep't of agrifor 1899 have been sent in by about 2000 correspondents. Secretary James makes the following official estimates therefrom:

a hay and clover yielded 1.49 tons p a, or a total of 2.498.705. The total acresage under crops was 8.757.926 in 1898, there were 8.8.5.272 a. Apples yielded 19.126.429 bu, or an average of 3.2 bu p tree of bearing age Of live stock, there were, horses 615.574 head, cattle 2.318.235, of which 975.698 were mileh cows, steep 1.712.66, hogs 1.971.610, poultry 9.344.600. During the year there were sold or slaughtered, horses 8.7556, cattle 555,585, sheep 665.208, logs 1.876.466, poultry 9.3102.614. The wool cup was 5.525.122 lbs.

The Horse Market is in a possuliar condition. The home government has placed an order for loss head for use in Africa, but before this order was placed, had bought heavily all through Ontario. With the cream of export horses bought up, the statistics recently given out from the office of the minister of agriculture for 1899 are of interest. In 1892 there were a total of nearly 689,660 horses in the province, in 183, 685,260, 194, 675,060, 195, 648,060, 196, 624,700, 197, 612,760, 198, 611,260. The stock of horses on hand last year included 420,560 working horses, 77,960 breeding mares and 102,860 of all others.

Ontario—Butter sold at 25 to 28c on Feb 1 at Hamilton, eggs 25c, wheat 66c, oats 30c, positions 55c, hay \$10 to 12, ont straw starce at \$7. The winter has been against wheat. 


