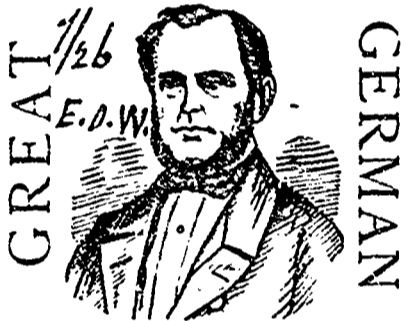

Scientific and Useful.

STRAWBERRY celery goes well with turkey. Cut in slices, cook in a very little salted water until tender, then thicken this water with a drawn butter and serve.

WHITE MOUNTAIN CAKE.—One cup of butter, 2 cups of sugar, white, of 8 eggs, beaten well, 1 teaspoonful of soda, 2 of cream tartar, 3 cups of flour. Bake in a deep cake pan.

WHITE MOUNTAIN JELLY CAKE.—Half cup of butter, 2 cups of sugar, whites of 8 eggs, well beaten, 1 cup of sweet milk, 3 cups of flour, 1 measure or 2 teaspoonfuls of baking powder. Bake in jelly pans and put together with clear jelly.

TURKEY stuffing of forcemeat is a novelty. So is a chestnut stuffing. Cook the forcemeat by making it up into a roll, with a layer of thin bacon tied on top; stew it either in hot water or stock, and let it cool with the bacon on it until you are ready to put it in the turkey.

MOLASSES COOKIES.—One cup of butter, two cups molasses, one teaspoonful cloves, one tablespoonful ginger, and sufficient flour to make a stiff batter, not dough. Mould with the hands into small cakes, and bake in a steady rather than quick oven, as they are apt to burn.

CREAMED POTATOES.—Cut cold boiled potatoes into cubes or thin slices. Put them into a shallow pan, cover with milk, and cook until the potatoes have absorbed nearly all the milk. To one pint of potatoes add a tablespoonful of butter, half a teaspoonful of salt, half a saltspoon of pepper, and a little chopped parsley.

SPONGE CAKE.—Eight eggs, 1 pound of sugar, three-quarters of a pound of flour. Beat the yolks of eggs and the sugar together 15 minutes. Add the whites, beaten to a stiff froth, and beat 15 minutes longer. Add the flour, which has been sifted, and bake in a slow oven three-quarters of an hour.

SPICED GRAPES.—Five pounds of grapes, 4 pounds of sugar, 1 pint of vinegar. Boil the sugar and vinegar, and pour over the grapes. The next day pour off the vinegar, boil and pour over them; repeat for 9 mornings. The last time add 1 tablespoonful of ground cloves and 1 of cinnamon. They will keep without sealing.

GOLD CAKE.—Yolks of 5 eggs, 1 1/2 cups of sugar, half cup of butter, half cup of sour cream, 1 teaspoonful of soda, 2 teaspoonfuls of cream tartar, 2 cups of flour. Beat the sugar and yolks of eggs together; when light, add the butter and cream, dissolve the soda and cream tartar, and lastly add the flour. Bake in rather quick oven.

QUEEN OF PUDDINGS. One pint of bread crumbs, 1 quart of sweet milk, 1 cup of sugar, butter size of an egg, yolk of 4 eggs, half the juice of a lemon. Bake as custard. Spread a layer of jelly over the pudding while hot. Beat the whites of 4 eggs well, add 1 cup of white sugar, juice of half a lemon. Cover with the frosting and bake until slightly brown. To be eaten cold.

APPLE CUSTARD PIE.—Take three large, sour apples, and pare, core, and slice them; line a deep pie plate with rich crust, then a layer of sliced apples, and sprinkle over them a layer of sugar, then another layer of apples and more sugar, and so on, until the dish is as full as you wish it, then grate half a nutmeg over them, and add 1 tablespoonful of butter. Lastly, pour over all, three tablespoonfuls of rich, sweet cream, and three of water. Bake in an even oven.
