Secondly—She will get her own property, if any is left to her, in her own hands; and third-is, sho will secure to herself the same right of self-government which every other religious denomination new enjoys. These are advantages of no trifling mag-nitude, and it remains for Churchmen in Canada to show that they are determined to secure them, and when obtained rightly to use them.—Iin. Empire.

May the number of such godly professors of the healing art increase and abound in our land, thus blest themselves and doubly blessing those whose bodily sufferings it is their delightful vocation to relieve.

Miss Dix.-This benevolent lady, who " goos about doing good," and devoting her time and means to the benefit of her distressed fellow creatures, bar been for some weeks amongst us, and in communication with those who have the control of the proposed Lumatic Asylum, and still we bear of no decisive step having been taken. It is deeply to be regretted that any unnecessary delay should take place, in removing from our Province the disgrace of being without an Anstitution for the rolief of the most pitiable portion of our people, when even the much smaller Province of P. E. Island has long possessed one, which however imperfect is still an evidence of their humane regard for the unfortunate, which Nova Scotia cannot produce. It is to be hoped that no political jealousies will be allowed to mar this good work.
