BEQUESTS TO THE VARIOUS SCHEMES OF THE CHURCH.

We publish the following letter for the purpose of pointing out to parties intending to bequeath a portion of their property to any of the objects of the Church, how important it is that due care be taken lest the intentions of the testator be frustrated. It should be borne in mind that all bequests for religious and charitable objects require to be paid from personal property—not from the proceeds of real estate. Had the property of the young man, referred to in the letter, been converted into personal estate, before his death, his intentions, with reference to the Church, would have been carried out:—

DEAR SIR,—Herewith you will please receive check for one hundred and thirty-seven dollars and fifty-three cents, being the whole available personal property of the estate of the late Samuel Stewart, of this city, who died about the end of May, 1861, leaving about \$1600 in mortgage securities and some personal accounts, and devising by will—

The will of the deceased having been made less than twelve months before his death, all estate savoring of Realty (viz.) mortgage securities, or freehold property, bequeathed to religious, charitable, or benevolent institutions, are rendered void by the Mortmain Act, consequently, the whole available amount arising out of this estate, for the above worthy objects, gives—

Whilst the large proportion of this estate has gone to relations in the second degree, having very slight claim upon the deceased.

Had this estate come to the executors in debentures, bank stock, promissory notes, accounts, merchandize, or cash, the will of this young man, who was an intelligent Presbyterian, and an earnest christian, would have been carried out fully, and the schemes of the Church he loved have derived the benefit he intended.
