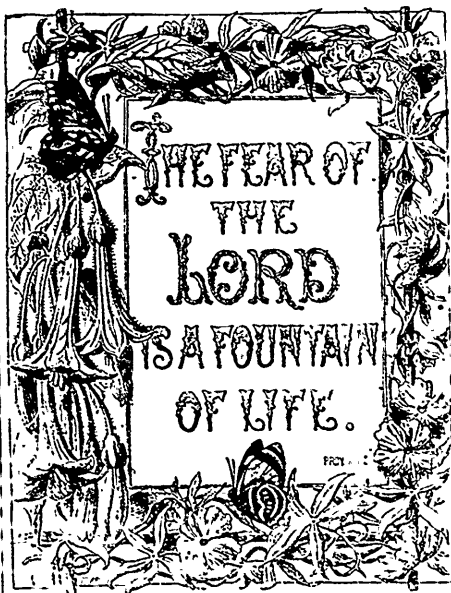

ANNUAL CONVENTION OF Y. M. C. A. SECRETARIES.

THE fifteenth Annual Conference of the Y. M. C. A. Secretaries of the United States and the British provinces convened in the city of Chattanooga, Tenn., on Friday evening, May 8th, and continued their session until the evening of May 11th, about 170 Secretaries were present. From all points of the compass they came, from distant Oregon and San Francisco, in the West, from Montreal and Toronto, in the North, New Orleans and Mobile, in the South, while the eastern states sent large delegations of their best and most experienced Secretaries.
