The members of the French delegation, headed by the distinguished General Pau, who have been visiting Australia and New Zealand, are re-turning to their homes via Canada and are to be the guests of the Dem-inion Government during their stay in this country

The mission is expected to arrive in Victoria, B.C., about the middle of this month and will be met on arrival there by Sir Joseph Pope, Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, who will represent the Government and accompany the party on their tour of the Dominion. About twenty days will be spent in Canada. twenty days will be spent in Canada during which time it is proposed to visit Victoria, Vancouver, Winnipeg, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and Quebee, where the members of the mission will probably deliver public addresses.
