28. Branch Offices of Diplomatic and Consular Missions

In accordance with general international practice, the Canadian Government does not permit the opening of branch offices of diplomatic and consular missions in localities other than those in which the diplomatic and consular missions are established.

29. Other Governmental Offices

Other governmental offices, such as trade offices, tourism offices, and information offices, and their personnel, are not entitled to any privileges, benefits, and immunities.

30. Immunities for Diplomatic and Consular Personnel

Diplomatic and consular personnel enjoy corresponding immunities in Canada pursuant to the Diplomatic and Consular Privileges and Immunities Act (Canada, 1977 as amended 1981) and the Vienna Conventions.

Diplomatic and consular personnel who are permanent residents of Canada enjoy immunities only in respect of acts performed in the exercise of their official functions.
