The Secretary of State of the United States of America to the Ambassador of Canada

Washington, March 22, 1976

EXCELLENCY:

I have the honor to refer to your Note No. 103 of March 19, 1976 in which you propose the renewal, for a further period of five years of the Agreement between the Government of the United States and the Government of Canada concerning a joint program in the field of experimental remote sensing from satellites and aircraft, which was effected by an exchange of notes done at Washington on May 14, 1971.

The proposed extension meets with the approval of the Government of the United States of America. I have the honor to confirm, therefore, that your Note and this reply shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments to extend the Agreement for a further period of five years commencing on May 14, 1975, it being understood that such Agreement may be terminated by either Government upon six months' notice to the other. This will also confirm that the present Agreement shall enter into force on the date of this reply with effect from May 14, 1975.

Accept, Excellency, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
