FINAL ACT OF THE THIRD UNITED NATIONS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CONFERENCE

- 1. The General Assembly, at its 389th plenary meeting of 25 October 1952, requested the President to appoint a Negotiating Committee for Extra-Budgetary Funds for the purpose of consulting with Member and non-member States as to the amounts which Governments might be willing to contribute on a voluntary basis towards, inter alia, the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance. The General Assembly decided further that upon the request of the Committee, the Secretary-General should arrange an appropriate meeting of Member and non-member States at which their pledges might be made known. On 17 November 1952, the Committee requested the Secretary-General to convene a meeting at which Governments would announce their contributions to the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance for the third financial period ending 31 December 1953. Accordingly, the Secretary-General convened the Third United Nations Technical Assistance Conference.
- 2. The Third United Nations Technical Assistance Conference met at Headquarters on 26 February 1953. The Governments of the following States were represented at the Conference by delegations:
