EXTRACTS from a Speech delivered by HIS
EXCELLENCY THE MARQUIS OF LORNE,
GOVERNOR-GENERAL OF CANADA, at Win-
nipeg, October 10, 1881.

HIS EXCELLENCY, who was very warmly received, said :—

MR CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,—I beg to thank you most cordially for the pleasant reception you have given me on my return to Winnipeg, and for the words in which you have proposed my health, and expressed a hope for the complete recovery of the Princess from the effects of that most unfortunate accident which took place at Ottawa. I know that the Canadian people will always remember that it was in sharing the duties incurred in their service that the Princess received injuries which have, I trust only temporarily, so much impaired her health. (Applause.) Two years hence, the journey I have undertaken will be an easy one to accomplish throughout its length for all, while at present the facilities of railway and steam accommodation only suffice for half of it.
