

at such election for Aldermen and Councillors shall be entitled to vote for the said Water Commissioner for his Ward, and not otherwise.

Be it therefore enacted, and it is hereby enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Hamilton, that Water Works for supplying the Inhabitants of the said City of Hamilton with water for all private and public purposes, shall be, and the same in pursuance of the powers and directions of the said recited Act are hereby authorized to be constructed, and the Mayor of the said City is hereby authorized and required within ten days from the passing of this By-Law, to issue his warrant to the Returning Officer for each Ward in the said City, requiring him to proceed to the election of a Water Commissioner for his Ward, as directed by the said Act.

PROVINCIAL PARLIAMENTARY ACTS  
IN THE TWENTY-NINTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA  
IN THE CITY OF HAMILTON  
THE SEVENTH DAY OF AUGUST 1856  
IT WAS ORDERED BY THE MAYOR, ALDERMEN AND COMMONALTY OF THE CITY OF HAMILTON, AS FOLLOWS:  
That the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Hamilton do hereby authorize and require the Mayor of the said City to issue his warrant to the Returning Officer for each Ward in the said City, requiring him to proceed to the election of a Water Commissioner for his Ward, as directed by the said Act.
