TREATY of AMERY, COMMERCE and NAVIGATION, between His Britannick Majesty and the United States of Signed at London, the 19th of November, 1794.

His Majesty's Ratification.

GEORGE R.

YEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, Duke of Brunfwick and Limenburgh, Arch-Treafurer and Prince Elector of the Holy Roman Empire, &c. To all and fingular to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas Our Right Trufty and Well-beloved Counfellor, William Wyndham, Baron Grenville of Wetton, Our Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, &c. &c. did, on Our Part, together with the Plempotentiary of Our good Friends the United States of America, conclude and fign at Lendon, on the Ninetcenth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninetyfour, a Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation between Us and Our faid good Friends: And whereas a certain additional Article has, on the Part of the faid United States, been propofed to be annexed to the faid Treaty as a Partthereof; to which Addition We are willing to confent; the faid Treaty and additional Article being in the Words following:

I IS Britannick Majefly and the United States of America, being defirous, by a Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation, to terminate their Differences in such a Manner as, without Reference to the Merits of their respective Complaints and Pretentions, may be the best calcufated to produce mutual Satisfaction and good Underflanding; and also to regulate the Commerce and Navigation between their respective Countries, Territories and People, in such a Manner as to render the fame reciprocally beneficial and fatisfactory; they have, respectively, named their Plenipotentiaries, and given them Full Powers to treat of and conclude the faid Treaty; that is to fay, His Britannich Majefty has named, for his Plenipotentiary, the Right Honourable William Wyndham, Baron Grenville of Wotton, one of His Majesty's Privy Council, and His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and the Prefident of the faid United States, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Senate thereof, hath appointed for their Plenipotentiary the Honomable John Jaz, Chief Justice of the faid United States, and their Envoy Extraordinary to His Majefly, who have agreed on and concluded the following Articles:

ARTICLE I. There shall be a firm, inviolable, and universal Peace, and a true and sincere Friendship between His Britannick Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and the United States of America; and between their respective Countries, Territories, Citics, Towns; and People, of every Degree, without Exception of Perfons or Places.

ART. II. His Majefly will withdraw all his Troops and Garrifons from all Poffs and Places within the Houndary Lines assigned by the Treaty of Peace to the United States. This Evacuation shall take Place on or before the First-Day of June, 1796; and all the proper Measures shall in the Interval be taken by Concert between the Government of the United States and His Mujefty's Governor-General in America, for fettling the previous Arrangements which may be need-
