WOULD COST \$200,000,000

Chief Engineer Raymond of the United States Army Proposes a Great Canal

FROM THE WEST TO THE ATLANTIC

A Uniform Depth of Thirty Feet From the Head of Lake Superior to the Seaboard.

Philadelphia, Aug. 1.—Major Charles W. Raymond, chief engineer of the United States Army for this city, left today for Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., to attend a meeting of the Deep Waterway Commission, of which he is president. The commission, which has held a number of meetings, will discuss and compare the final surveys made for the contemplated route of the waterway from the great lakes to the Atlantic Ocean.

The Route Proposed.

Before leaving today his route to be followed will be through the Sault Ste. Marie Canal to Lake Huron, through the river to Lake Erie, thence by ship canal around Niagara Falls to Lake Ontario. The question confronting the commission at this point is whether or not the route should be utilized by deepening, as it is now totally inadequate for the passage of deep draught, or a new canal built in the same territory. This has not been the more desirable for international reasons.

A Depth of 30 Feet.

A depth of 30 feet throughout the waterway should be sufficient to carry any vessel to the ocean. The cutting scheme contemplated some very serious engineering problems, particularly the system of locks. From the point above mentioned the Hudson River. The two known routes, the Oswego-Mohawk route and the other as the Champlain-St. Lawrence route. The Champlain-St. Lawrence route has been surveyed from Lake St. Francis, which is an arm of the St. Lawrence, diagonally across to the Richelieu River, through this lake by means of a canal, and thence to the Gulf of St. Lawrence.
