A note accompanying the passports explained that the German reply to China's submarine warfare protest was unsatisfactory. The passports, the note added were "for protection while leaving Chinese territory."

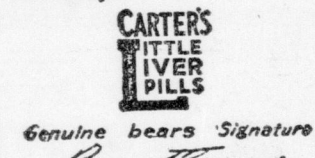

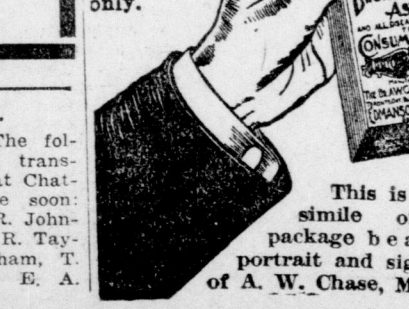
The reply received reads:

## THE "HIGH COST" OF FURNITURE DOES NOT BOTHER GOVERNMENT

Tiles and Mantels Cost More \$58,857.

THREE RUGS COST \$4,000

Draperies for Servants' Quarters Almost Thirty-Five Hundred Dollars.

TORONTO, March 16.—Much interesting information came to light in the public accounts committee when the cost of the furnishings of the new Government House was discussed. The total amount which had been expended on the Government House was \$162,412.69, but it was an amount of \$58,857.61 paid to the T. Eaton Company, Limited, for the mantels and decorative features. Mr. Hurdman, Ottawa, asked if it was because the T. Eaton estimates were lower that they received so much of the work.

R. B. Fairbairn, deputy minister of public works—We usually found their tenders lower than those of anyone else.

Rug Prices.

Rugs for the state room, drawing-room and living-room were bought with the view that they must be in keeping with the rest of the furnishings of the mansion. The Donegal rug in the state room cost \$1,230, other in the drawing-room \$1,380, living-room \$1,198. A Wilton rug in the state room only cost \$898. The Wilton carpet in the private dining-room was less expensive, costing only \$210.

One item for \$1,725 represented the purchase of seven pieces of furniture. Another item was for 60 living-room chairs at \$24 each. Hartley Dewart, K. C., wanted to know if the amount of \$16,232.75 covered the total cost of the furniture. He was told that such was not the case, and that he would have to travel a good deal further in his inquiries before he would be able to find what the total expenditure for furniture has been.

An item of \$700 for a commode caused the opposition to inquire if this were some special kind of an article.

Mr. Fairbairn—It is a cabinet for curios.

Curtains at \$120 Per Pair.

The committee then turned its attention to curtains. A pair of flannel curtains cost \$120, four pairs of special green silk curtains in the private dining-room ran a close race for honors with eight pairs of rose silk curtains costing \$800.

The curtains over the archway into the ballroom cost \$445.

Mr. Sinclair wanted to know if there had been any extravagance in the purchase of furnishings.

Mr. Fairbairn—There has been nothing unreasonable or extravagant. Everything was bought for the best price that could be obtained.

The suite for the duke's bedroom cost \$1,589. "Now we will turn to the servants' quarters," said Mr. Dewart.

The first items encountered in this quarter were \$3,489.91 for draperies and \$2,656 for finishing hardware.

## REVOLUTION SWIFTLY SPREADS TO GREAT INTERIOR OF RUSSIA

Municipalities Declare Intention of Joining Committee.

LONDON, March 16.—A Stockholm dispatch to the Frankfurter Zeitung, as cabled from Amsterdam by the Central News correspondent, says it is learned that the Russian municipalities of Kazan, Kharkov and Odessa have issued declarations expressing their intention of joining the executive committee of the revolution and organizing themselves for the internal deliverance of Russia.

This dispatch indicates the rapid spread of the revolutionary movement through the interior of Russia. Kazan is an important city of Eastern Russia, in the Volga region. Odessa and Kharkov are two of the principal municipalities of Southern Russia.

## MOSCOW ARSENAL TAKEN.

MOSCOW, March 16.—Via London.—The greatest enthusiasm has prevailed here since March 1. Thousands of persons have marched the streets, and packed the squares, cheering for the revolution. Troops and students have been enrolled by the defence committee.

A thousand members of the police force have been arrested and are confined in the town hall. The jails have been opened and prisoners liberated. The Kremlin, the arsenal, and all public utilities have been taken over by the revolutionists.

## SARATOV POLICE GIVE IN.

SARATOV, Russia, via London.—March 16.—A public safety committee is in control of affairs here. The governor made his escape from the city, but the police submitted to the revolutionists.

## TSARITSIN SWEARS ALLEGIANCE.

TSARITSIN, Government of Saratov, Russia, via London.—March 16.—At the town hall and the bureau revolutionary committees have been organized, backed up by the troops. Dispatches are sent to the same committee in Petrograd assuring it of the allegiance of the people here.

The newspapers are printing all the news.

## NO DISORDER IN KHARKOV.

KHARKOV, Russia, via London.—March 16.—The population of Kharkov is supporting the new Government fully. There is great excitement here, but no disorder.

## PRUSSIA THREATENED WITH REVOLUTION, IS SOCIALISTS' WARNING

"Junkerism" Attacked After Hollweg's Speech.

THE HAGUE, via London, March 16.—The debate in the Prussian Diet on Wednesday after the address by the imperial chancellor, Dr. von Bethmann-Hollweg, was remarkable for its slashing attacks on "Junkerism" by Socialist factions.

Herr Leinert, a Socialist Democrat, according to the Berlin Vorwaerts of Thursday, denounced the upper chamber of the Diet, which, he said, regarded the Government as the mere caretaker of their own selfish interests, and where nothing counted but shameful profiteering. Declaring that the reorganization of that body as suggested by the National Liberals was useless, he added:

"We must abolish the Herrenhaus, which is a millstone around the neck of any progressive development in Prussia."

Count Yorck Upbraided.

Deputy Leinert also upbraided Count Yorck, who had attacked the Socialist leader, Carl Legien, because, the reports add, that after the break between Germany and the United States, he had promised the American Federation of Labor that he would bring the influence of the German workmen's unions to bear upon the Government.

"Such influence," Herr Leinert is reported to have said, "the Herrenhaus regards as its own special prerogative. It wants the country to be commanded into war and out of it, and that things after it should remain as they were."

No Longer Serfs.

"We are no longer serfs whom the king can buy and sell or order us to bleed and die at the word of command. We are a nation that has reached political manhood."

Amid intermittent cheers, Herr Leinert hinted at a time coming when the whole nation would arise and sweep "Junkerism" off the earth.

Adolf Hoffmann of the Socialist workmen's union, in supporting the desire for peace, is reported to have ridiculed the idea of a complete German victory, saying that there will be no German soldier left alive.

Sub Campaign Denounced.

The German submarine campaign was denounced as inhuman, and the German peace offer of last December was characterized as ridiculous, in a stormy speech by Deputy Hoffmann, Socialist.

## TORY STALWART SAYS HIS PARTY IS WRONG

Made Mistakes on Votes for Women and Prohibition, He Tells Dutton Meeting.

ST. THOMAS, March 16.—At the annual meeting of the West Elgin Liberal-Conservative Association held today it was decided to amalgamate the two classes of the association. The election of officers for the joint association resulted as follows: President, Archibald McMillan; Vice-President, James Fuiler; Secretary, Andrew Ingram, Jr.; St. Thomas; Chairman of municipalities—Aldborough; Duncan B. McColl; Dunwich, Alex. McKillop; Southwold, W. B. Prangerine; St. Thomas, C. A. Hammond; Patrick Meehan and F. W. Wright; West Elgin, Malcolm McKillop; Dutton, A. E. Roberts.

A resolution was adopted declining to allow the above executive power to add to its number the Hon. J. M. Dutton. This was for the purpose of giving the women voters an opportunity should they form an association to be represented on the committee.

At the conclusion of the business Hon. T. W. Crothers and Hon. F. G. MacDiarmid addressed the gathering.

W. K. Cameron of St. Thomas moved that the women be placed on the representative committee, as it would be dangerous if they were left out.

W. B. McColl declared that the Conservative party made a mistake on the prohibition question, and that Mr. Crothers was wrong when he said women ought to have a vote.

In his speech, the minister of labor declared that if it had not been for his trip to the west to settle the coal strike, people would have frozen to death on the prairies and that millions of factories would have been compelled to stop operations.

He also credited Premier Borden with having foreseen the war, and prepared for it. As an explanation of the present high cost of living, he declared 30,000,000 men had gone from productive to destructive work.

On the returned soldier question, he promised that the returned men would be given civil service jobs.

## FINNISH TROOPS REFUSE TO OBEY AUTOCRATIC RULE

LONDON, March 16.—An Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Stockholm quotes the Alttiedast as stating that the Finnish railway lines have been blown up at several points and that the train service between Haparanda, Sweden, and Tornio, Finland, has been suspended for more than a fortnight. Huge quantities of goods are stored at the former place.

Finnish troops, the dispatch adds, refused to obey orders from the late government to proceed to Petrograd, and a large number of them are supporting the new government.

## FRENCH CABINET TO BE RECONSTRUCTED TODAY

PARIS, March 16.—The French cabinet will be reconstructed. Premier Briand, it is understood, in addition to replacing Gen. Lyautey, the former minister of war, will have the departments, which had been combined under one minister, restored to their former status. It is expected that the premier will be able to submit the names of the new ministers to President Poincaré tomorrow.
