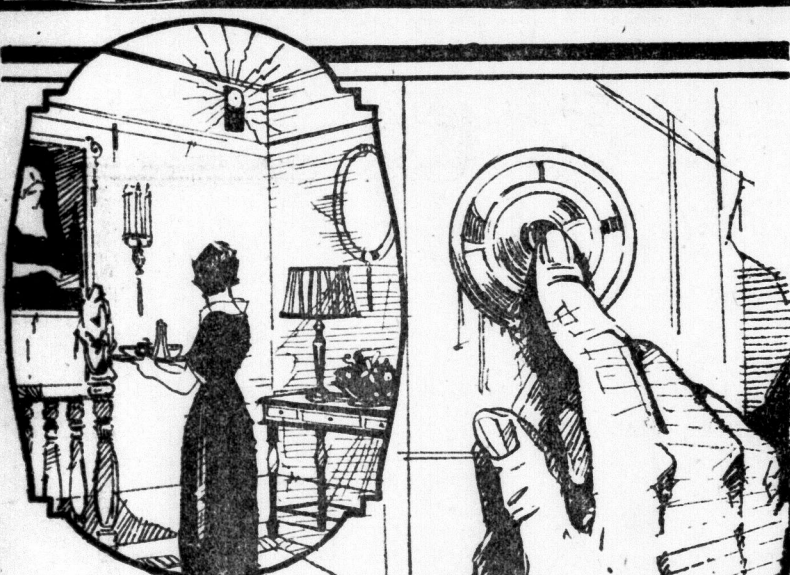

St. Thomas Side Penalized for Breach of Discipline in the W. F. A. Opener Here.

INTERNATIONAL IS WON BY ENGLAND; 5,000 SEE THE GAME

Copy of Big Soccer Classic at Springbank Provides Good Game.

England won from Scotland in the international game played at Springbank on Victoria Day by the score of 2 to 0. Over 5,000 spectators witnessed the game, which because of the warm weather, was at times very hard on the players. In the first period, after the president took the kick-off, both teams went out to score, but neither succeeded until the last of the period, when England took a penalty kick and sent the ball past Garrow, who could not have stopped it under any circumstances. A little later on they were awarded another penalty kick. In this they were also successful. When the referee blew his whistle for half-time the score was 2 to 0 in favor of the English. In the second period, England settled down and played a better combination game than their opponents. No scoring took place in this period, and the game ended with the score 2 to 0, with the English the victors.
